

OBAKE, WHAT'S THAT?



The Obaké (pronounced Obakay) are supernatural, shapeshifting spirits from Japanese animist folklore. They are also called Bakemono meaning "the things that change".

The initial shape of a Bakemono can be an animal, the spirit of a plant or inanimated object possessing a soul in Shinto.

Both admired and feared, they personify all the facets of the living world, sometimes perfidious, sometimes well-meaning, guides or troublemakers, wise or irreverent. Most of the time they are almost invisible and they always choose the time and place of their appearance. With their shape-shifting ability, these creatures encourage us to see behind appearances, questioning reality and our certitudes.

Like the buffoon, their use of the burlesque and the ridiculous is never only to amuse us.

A TOUR BY BIKE:

For whom and why?

In order to reconcile the joy of live performances and all that involves life on tour. The ridiculous distances, the days spent in black boxes, don't coincide with our aspirations. With this project we aspire to established a coherence between the creation and the diffusion of our performance, taking into account the ecological issues of our time.

Our ideal with "Obaké", would be to tour by bike for several days through a given region performing as we go. In order to coordinate places and dates, we wish to work together with local partners involved in the creation and organisation of this kind of tour.

We want to bring live performances to unusual places and for a wide variety of spectators and hope to meet with similar preoccupations from our partners. And maybe encourage the public to reconsider how they travel to and from the performance.

Obaké artists are members of **Armodo**, the soft arts network, an international network made up of actors from the artistic sector acting on ecological and social issues through creation, hosting or touring shows in soft mobility.


